Clients with unrealistic expectations, not being on time, being disrespectful of your education and pricing, there's a reason why you left the place before, pay for expertise and artistry.

You are going to need to eat, buy school clothes and whatnot by the time unemployment ends. If you haven't been working the market will be so saturated.

Go to school. Research the school. Took me time to weigh between three schools. I drove two hours to go to the one I chose.

"How do you wipe your ass with extremely long nails"....Same way you do with your nubs.


